Military Makeover Sponsorship



We are so thankful to be part of the special series - Military Makeover, which offers hope and a helping hand here on the home front to members of our military and their loved ones, transforming the homes and lives of military families across the country.

DVNF contributed with \$40,000 to the special home improvement of the Army Staff Sergent, Daniel Burgess.

Daniel was working with Marines in Helmand Province to clear a village of 42 improvised Explosive Devices (IEDs). Tragedy struck as Daniel worked with a local villager to determine the location of an IED. Suddenly, a terrible explosion ripped through the Afhgan desert. Daniel had stepped on a hidden IED. He lost his right leg, sustained severe damage to his left leg, and suffered traumatic brain injury, burns, fractures, and multitude of other injuries. The arduous recovery process from his catastrophic injuries is still ongoing.
